Case Review Discussion:

Kids in care on and off since 2010, consistently since 2012, 2013.

1st perm plan was reunification with a concurrent plan of adoption and TPR

2 phases to TPR: grounds case (ie. Length of time in CHIPS, abandonment, failure to assume parental responsibility) and disposition.

Legal barriers:

- changing workers, 5 workers, 3 DA
- s, 3 judges
- Dad incarcerated, over 52,000 pages of discovery
- Mom often incarcerated.
- 1st attempt at TPR in 2013: dismissed due to typo, 2nd time dismissed due to conditions not attached.
- Difficulty finding attys. To represent parents, and a lot of attorneys won't take TPR cases
- Dismissed again as mom claimed Native American blood
- Workers not prepared for depositions
- Conditions had to be re-written
- Documentation lacking of notice to dad
- Difference between suspension and denial of visits; only the court can deny visits
- New TPR petitions filed in 2016; hired private attorneys, dismissed on summary judgment.
- Nov. 20, 2018: grounds found Dispo held Dec. 18. Notice of intent to appeal filed by dad

Issues:

- Need more legal training for social workers or a paralegal on staff
- Lack of attys willing to take TPR cases
- Need more support for foster parents
- Saw the GAL once in 6 years
- Cases bumped for criminal cases
- · Lack of enough district attorneys

- TPR supposed to happen after 15 out of 22 months
- Can appoint reserve judges
- Trials should happen in 45 days
- Lack of court time
- Difficulty scheduling court due to attorney schedules/vacations/etc.

Things that have changed:

- DA's office will be drafting TPRs, not workers
- DA's office is hiring two attorneys and a paralegal

Crisis in out of home care—next steps: Melissa. Can we look at stats from other counties? How many kids are in out of home care? What is the average length of time in care? What is the average length of time in care in Outagamie County? What could CRP do:

- Advertise need for foster parents on website and facebook. Goal is to reduce kids in out of home care by 30%.
- Support the resolution to fully fund child protective services at \$30 million.
- Advocate for stopping repetitive reporting requirements.
- Advocate for affordable housing
- Help with hiring and retaining staff
- Suggest a statewide meeting focused on the crisis
- Support Families First federal legislation
- Ask Alicia about support for the \$30 million resolution.
- o Attend and speak at May Outagamie County budget meetings
- o See if United Way policy committee is interested in pursuing this issue: Mary will check.
- Send out the budget
- o Contact Chris Czarnik about recruitment strategies for child protection workers.

Period of Purple Crying (Andrea): Update: Mary is trying to set up a training session for the Community Health Center staff about sentinel injuries. Not sure if date has been confirmed.

GAL Task Team (Andrea); Update: Team is putting the final revisions on the survey and will be sending it out. It will be a bit broader than just questions about GALs: It will also have questions about the system and the process. Once the results are tabulated, team will review and chunk out the issues that need attention and see if there are ways the CRP can assist. Team will meet in April with final product to review and send out. Michelle Swardinski joined the task group.
